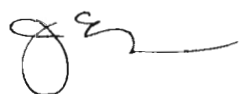

(1) Call to Order

Mayor Flippo called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with a quorum present.

a. Action regarding Approval of Minutes, April 7, 2020

b. Action regarding Resolution No. 2020-12 to deny the DCRF Amendment proposed by Oncor

Summary: The City is an electric utility customer of Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC. The Oncor Cities Steering Committee (OCSC) is a coalition of similarly situated cities served by Oncor that have joined together to efficiently and cost effectively review and respond to electric issues affecting rates charged in Oncor's Service area in matters before the Public Utility Commission (PUC) and the courts. On April 3rd Oncor filed an Application to Amend its Distribution Cost Recovery Factor (DCRF) with each of the cities retaining original jurisdiction and with the Commission in Docket No. 50734. In the filing, the Company sought to increase distribution rates by \$75.9 million annually (an approximately \$0.88 increase to the average residential customer's bill). The resolution authorizes the City to join with OCSC to evaluate the filing, determine whether the filing complies with law, and if lawful, to determine what further strategy, including settlement, to pursue. Resolution No. 2020-12 addresses this and denies the proposed amendment.

c. Action regarding an Individual Project Order with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. for Design of Old Decatur Road and WJ Boaz Intersection

Summary: On February 18th the City Council conducted a "Mid-Term Capital Improvement Project Planning" Workshop to review projects that might be considered as short-term or interim projects leading up to the proposed 2020 Bond Election. The design of the Old Decatur Road and WJ Boaz intersection. At that meeting the Council directed staff to bring back a design contract for consideration. Contract expenditures will be funded in the interim through the Fund Balance with the intent of reimbursing the fund with a future funding mechanism. In the proposed Individual Project Order, Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. proposes to provide services for this design for a total fee of \$130,000.

d. Action regarding Resolution No. 2020-13 regarding the City of Saginaw's Participation in Tarrant County's Community Development Block Grant, Home Investment Partnership and Emergency Solutions Grant Consortium for the Three Program Year Period, Fiscal Year 2021 through Fiscal Year 2023

Summary: In order to continue to receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership and Emergency Solution Grants (ESG) Entitlement funding through 2023, Tarrant County must once again qualify as an Urban County under the CDBG, HOME and ESG programs. Entitlement counties, such as Tarrant County must re-qualify every three years for funding. Tarrant County is eligible to receive entitlement grant funds by having a combined population of 200,000 or more from unincorporated areas and participating municipalities. Resolution No. 2020-13 will authorize the City's continued participation in the consortium.

e. Action regarding Public Highway Overpass Agreement with Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRR) for the Bailey Boswell Road Overpass

Summary: The proposed Overpass Agreement with Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRR) provides for the obligations of UPRR and the City associated with the construction of the Bailey Boswell Road overpass over UPRR right-of-way. The agreement calls for special contract provisions that will be incorporated into the City's construction contract including insurance and agreements that must be entered into between UPRR and the contractor. In the agreement, UPRR grants the City the right to construct, maintain and repair the structure (overpass) over and across UPRR for a sum of \$1,000. The agreement also requires a sum of \$50,000 for UPRR engineering and related services, construction management, construction observation and plan review for the work. The sum is an estimate and can be

recalculated based on fluctuations in quantity or cost of material and/or labor. Flagman is not included in the costs. The total estimated financial impact will be \$51,000. Funds are available to cover this expenditure in the 2015 and 2017 G.O. Bonds.

- f. Action regarding Ordinance No. 2020-11, amending Saginaw City Code Section 6-37, “Keeping of Animals and Fowl”; Amending standards for keeping backyard chickens
Summary: The current City Ordinance, approved in 2018, sets forth the regulations and standards for keeping backyard chickens. The proposed ordinance increases the number of backyard chickens allowed from three to six.

- g. Action regarding Award of Contract for East McLeroy Boulevard Curb and Gutter Improvements
Summary: On April 16, 2019, City Council approved an Individual Project Order (IPO) with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. for McLeroy Boulevard Curb and Gutter Replacement. The IPO, as approved, was limited to preparation of construction documents only with bidding and construction phase services deferred to a later date pending project selection for the proposed 2020 Bond Program. On January 21, 2020, City Council authorized Amendment No. 1 to the IPO to add construction phase services. On March 3, 2020, City Council authorized Amendment No. 2 adding proposed top of curb grades to the plans. On May 13, 2020, eighteen bids were received for the project with the low bidder being Nu-Way Construction with a bid of \$308,675. Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. reviewed the bids and references and has recommended award of the contract to Nu-Way Construction. Funds for this project are budgeted in the Street Maintenance Fund.

Mayor Flippo received requests from the City Council to pull Items 4b and 4e for discussion.

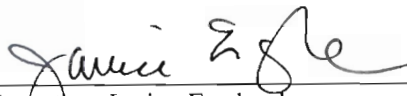
