c. Action regarding Resolution No. 2020-20, Approving a Negotiated Settlement between the Atmos Cities Steering Committee (ACSC) and Atmos Energy Corp., Mid-Tex Division regarding the Company's 2020 Rate Review Mechanism Filing

Summary: Saginaw is one of 172 cities who are members of the ACSC. Atmos filed a rate review request in March asking for additional revenues. ACSC's consultants reviewed the request and prepared a report for the ACSC Executive Committee who negotiated the attached settlement with Atmos. The impact of the settlement on an average residential bill is an increase of \$5.15 on a monthly basis, or 9.9 percent. The increase for an average commercial bill will be \$15.48 or 6.56 percent. These rates become effective December 1, 2020. Resolution No. 2020-20 addresses the settlement agreement.

d. Action regarding MedStar CARES Act Funding Request

Summary: On May 19, 2020 the City Council approved an interlocal agreement with Tarrant County governing the Allocation of federal assistance funds. The City received the Tarrant County allocation of \$1,230,900 on July 23, 2020. MedStar has submitted a request for a portion of the allocation for additional costs necessary to provide service during the COVID-19 pandemic. MedStar is requesting a proportionate share of \$4,029.20 of the City's CARES Act funding distribution from Tarrant County.

Mayor Pro-Tem Junkersfeld suggested the City host a “National Night Out” Event for residents on October 3rd, the Saturday before National Night Out. She suggested a kid’s parade that could begin at the Recreation Center and end at the Farmer’s Market area at the Saginaw Switchyard in Willow Creek Park. Other activities suggested included farmer’s market, food trucks, animal adoptions, performances by school choirs or bands. She added that face masks and social distancing would be required. There was some discussion. The consensus of the Council was to hold an event on October 3rd if the details can be worked out and with the understanding that face masks and social distancing will be required.

Provident Realty is considering purchasing and developing the property at the northwest corner of Blue Mound Road and East McLeroy Boulevard.


